PA10T/PS10/P1-10 Backlight Replacement

Introduction

These instructions explain how to replace backlight bulbs. The instructions include steps for disassembling the unit, removing the old bulbs, installing new ones, and reassembling the unit. These instructions are used with replacement kit BLR-6101. Follow the section of these instructions that applies to your unit.

Bulb kit BLR-6101 is used in the following platform and model numbers of Color Power-Stations.

^{*} This number is the last three digits of the unit serial number found on the Model/Serial number label.

Note

Due to the unknown manufacturing time frame of this change, the date code on the back of the display must be checked in order to purchase the correct BLR kit. Date codes of 2X XXXXXX and higher require the BLR-6101 kit. The "2" specifies the year 2002 while the "X" specifies October. An example of a higher date code would be "2Y". Date codes of 2W XXXXXX or lower require the BLR-6100 bulb kit. An example of a lower date code would be "1F", which was manufactured in 2001.

The date code of the display is located on the back of the display. The figures below illustrate the label location. The left represents display types supported by the BLR-6100 kit while the right figure represents display types supported by the BLR-6101 kit.





Figure 1 Display Date Label Locations



For safety reasons, the unit should be opened only by qualified service personnel.

Be sure to observe electrostatic discharge (ESD) precautions while working inside the unit.

Before You Start

You must remove the unit from its enclosure (if installed) to gain access to the display. Consult the appropriate PowerStation User Guide for your system if you need help with the removal.

To complete these instructions, you will need the following items:

- The backlight bulb replacement kit that you purchased, which includes the following:
 - 1 backlight replacement bulb
 - Electrostatic Discharge Kit
- Flat-head screwdriver
- Phillips-head screwdriver

Electrostatic Discharge Precautions

Modern integrated electronic devices, especially CPUs and memory chips, are extremely sensitive to electrostatic discharges (ESD) and fields. Before you disassemble the PowerStation, be sure to use the Electrostatic Discharge Kit to protect you and the PowerStation from harm resulting from ESD.

Important Open the Electrostatic Discharge Kit and follow the directions for attaching the wrist strap and handling sensitive electronic components.

Disassembling the PA10T Unit

To disassemble the unit, complete the following steps:

- 1. Turn off the unit.
- 2. Disconnect the unit from the power source.
- 3. Disconnect all cables attached to the unit.
- 4. Remove the unit from its enclosure, and place it on its back on a static dissipative mat in a location free from dirt and moisture and protected against static discharge.




Figure 2 Removing the Touchscreen Screws

- 5. Remove the 12 screws that secure the touchscreen to the unit shown in *Figure 2*.




Figure 3 Disassembling the Touchscreen

6. Carefully lift the touchscreen and lay it aside, as shown in *Figure 3*.

7. Disconnect the touchscreen cable shown in *Figure 3*.

This will free the touchscreen from the rest of the unit. The touchscreen may be placed aside.




Figure 4 Disconnecting the Display Cable

8. Disconnect the display cable, shown in *Figure 4*, from the board.

- 9. Remove the four screws that secure the display unit.
- 10. Gently lift the display unit out of the shell.




Figure 5 Disconnecting the Backlight Cable

- 11. Disconnect the backlight cable, shown in *Figure 5*, from the display.

Disassembling the PS10/PC10/PX10 and P1 10" Units

To disassemble the unit, complete the following steps:

- 1. Turn off the unit.
- 2. Disconnect the unit from the power source.
- 3. Disconnect all cables attached to the unit.
- 4. Remove the unit from its enclosure, and place it on its back on a static dissipative mat in a location free from dirt and moisture and protected against static discharge.
- 5. Remove the 12 screws that secure the touchscreen to the unit shown in *Figure* 6.




Figure 6 Removing the Touchscreen Screws




Figure 7 Disassembling the Touchscreen

6. Carefully lift the touchscreen and lay it aside, as shown in *Figure 7*.

7. Disconnect the touchscreen cable shown in *Figure 7*.

This will free the touchscreen from the rest of the unit. The touchscreen may be placed aside.




Figure 8 Disassembling the Display Unit

8. Disconnect the backlight cable, shown in *Figure 8*, from the inverter.

- 9. Remove the four screws, shown in figure 8, that secure the display unit.
- 10. Gently lift the display unit out of the shell.




Figure 9 Disconnecting the Display Cable

- 11. Disconnect the display cable, shown in Figure 9.

Note

The unit displayed in *Figure 9* is a PS10 Bright Color PowerStation, which includes a reflective metal noise shield behind the display unit. Your PowerStation will not include this noise shield...

Removing Backlight Bulb (all units)

To remove the old backlight bulb, complete the following steps:




Figure 10 Removing the Backlight Bulb

- 1. Locate the backlight bulb on the side of the display unit. See *Figure 10*.
- 2. While pushing the tab towards the top of the bulb, as shown in *Figure 10*, gently pull the backlight bulb cable to remove the bulb.

Installing Backlight Bulb (all units)

To install the new backlight bulb, complete the following steps:

Important Make sure that all of the backlight and display components are free of dust or dirt before you assemble them.

- 1. Insert the new bulb into the socket where you removed the old bulb.
- 2. Slide the bulb completely into the socket until it locks in place.

Reassembling the PA10T Unit

To reassemble the unit, complete the following steps:

- 1. Reconnect the backlight cable, ensure you properly line up the connector tabs.
- 2. Replace the display unit and align it with its screw holes.

Important The touchscreen cable should be threaded under the display unit and up through the opening at the left side of the display unit (when the PowerStation is on its back). See *Figure 3* for the proper placement of the touchscreen cable.

- 3. Screw the display unit into place using the four screws you previously removed.
- 4. Re-attach the touchscreen cable.

- 5. Lay the touchscreen on the unit.
- 6. Replace the 12 screws you previously removed to secure the touchscreen to the unit.

This completes the assembly of the unit. You may now install your PowerStation in its protective enclosure and connect the power.

When you first operate the unit, you may need to calibrate the touchscreen. If the position of the cursor does not match the location where the user touches the screen, see *Calibrating the Touchscreen* in the appropriate PowerStation User Guide for your system.

Reassembling the PS10/PC10/PX10 and P1 10" Units

To reassemble the unit, complete the following steps:

- 1. With the PowerStation resting on its back, reconnect the display cable.
- 2. Replace the display unit and align it with its screw holes.

Important The touchscreen cable should be threaded under the display unit and up through the opening at the left side of the display unit (when the PowerStation is on its back with the inverter on the right side of the unit). See *Figure 7* for the proper placement of the touch-screen cable.

- 3. Screw the display unit into place using the four screws you previously removed.
- 4. Re-attach the backlight cable.
- 5. Re-attach the touchscreen cable.
- 6. Lay the touchscreen on the unit.
- 7. Replace the 12 screws you previously removed to secure the touchscreen to the unit.

This completes the assembly of the unit. You may now install your PowerStation in its protective enclosure and connect the power.

When you first operate the unit, you may need to calibrate the touchscreen. If the position of the cursor does not match the location where the user touches the screen, see *Calibrating the Touchscreen* in the appropriate PowerStation User Guide for your system.
