

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Manual Overview and Support Services

Thank you for purchasing the MotionPanel™ workstation. MotionPanel is an intelligent computer system that allows you to program and monitor high-speed motion controls. Based upon CTC's PowerStation Model P1 workstation, it is factory-configured to communicate via Ethernet with the Compumotor 6K series of controllers. Thus, it takes advantage of the speed of Ethernet communication and the 6K's fast status register.

MotionPanel has a durable, 5.7" touchscreen display, available in monochrome or color. It also has an all-in-one PC board with a parallel port, two serial ports, and an Ethernet port. CTC Parker's MachineShop™ Shell and a complete Interact application, created with Interact's Panel Toolkit Module (PTM), are pre-installed. Please review this manual and the other documentation included with MotionPanel before operating the unit.

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Using this Manual

This manual is designed to help you set up and use your MotionPanel workstation.

The manual is divided into the following chapters:

Chapter 1 — Manual Overview and Support Services: Presents an overview of this manual, the other documentation and software provided with MotionPanel, and advice about getting started with MotionPanel. This chapter also describes CTC's customer support services.

Chapter 2 — Getting Started with MotionPanel: Describes how to connect MotionPanel to a Compumotor 6K controller and configure your network for Ethernet or serial communication.

Chapter 3 — **MachineShop for MotionPanel:** Gives an overview of the MachineShop for MotionPanel software and explains how to use the FlashBack utility to create a bootable Compact Flash card for MotionPanel.

Chapter 4 — MotionPanel Screens: Outlines the structure of MotionPanel's screens and describes each screen.

MotionPanel Documentation

The MotionPanel documentation set contains the information that you need to configure, install, and use MotionPanel. The documentation set is described below. The MotionPanel and PowerStation Model P1 *User Guides* are contained in PDF files on the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD.

Release Notes — Provided whenever there is important information about MotionPanel that does not appear in this manual. Be sure to read any available release notes before installing or operating the unit.

MotionPanel QuickStart Guide — Describes how to connect MotionPanel and a Compumotor 6K controller via Ethernet.

MotionPanel Demonstration CD — Contains a video demonstration of MotionPanel's main features and how to connect MotionPanel and a Compumotor 6K controller via Ethernet.

MotionPanel User Guide — The document you are reading. It provides detailed information about Motion-Panel and describes how to use the unit. Please read this manual before operating MotionPanel.

PowerStation Model P1 User Guide — Provides complete specifications, installation instructions, and troubleshooting steps for the MotionPanel workstation.

P1 PowerStation Template — A full-size template of MotionPanel that you can use to prepare the location where you will install the unit.

Related Documentation

In addition to the MotionPanel documentation described earlier, you will find the following documentation useful. The software documentation is contained in PDF files on the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD.

Software Documentation

MachineShop Installation Booklet — Explains how to install MachineShop for MotionPanel software. This manual is shipped with the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD.

MachineShop Getting Started Guide —Tells how to get up and running with MachineShop.

MachineShop Runtime Guide — Provides instructions on how to use the MachineShop Shell to monitor and configure a MotionPanel or other workstation communicating with a MachineShop development system.

Note Throughout this manual, all references to "development PC" or "development system" refer to the computer you use to develop applications.

Electronic Documentation

MachineShop and Interact Online Help — Explains how to perform all operations of MachineShop and Interact. This online help is available within Machine-Shop and Interact. To access the online help for a specific part of each program, press the F1 key on your keyboard.

Interact Online Tutorial — Gives step-by-step instructions for creating Interact applications using the Panel Toolkit Module (PTM). This online help file is designed to be run on a MachineShop development system.

Software Components

Each MotionPanel is shipped with the MS-DOS® 6.22 operating system, the MachineShop Shell, and a complete Interact runtime application installed on a Compact Flash (CF) card. The application consists of over 45 pre-configured screens created with Interact's Panel Toolkit Module (PTM).

CTC Parker also provides MachineShop for MotionPanel software on the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD (KA-83233) so that you can customize the Interact application. For information about what is included in this software, see Chapter 3, *MachineShop for MotionPanel*.

Getting Started

Now that you have opened the MotionPanel package, you can complete the following steps to get started with MotionPanel:

- Unpack the unit
- Connect it to a Compumotor 6K controller
- Configure your specific application parameters in MachineShop for MotionPanel
- Download these settings to the MotionPanel CF card.
- Connect it to a Compumotor 6K controller
- Install the MotionPanel in a permanent location

This section gives some tips on performing these activities. More detailed information is available in the remaining chapters of this manual and the other documentation referred to in this chapter.

Before You Begin

Before you connect the MotionPanel to a 6K controller or mount the MotionPanel in a permanent location, please complete the following steps:

- 1. Unpack the MotionPanel, and verify that you have received all the components you ordered.
- 2. Fill out the product registration card, and return it to CTC Parker. When you register your unit, you will receive a trial membership in CTC Parker's Product Support Program, which provides complimentary telephone technical support, information on product updates, and service bulletins.

Testing the Network Connection

Before you mount the MotionPanel in a permanent location, you may want to connect it to a 6K controller and test the network connection. Instructions for connecting MotionPanel to a 6K controller and configuring your network for Ethernet or serial communication are in Chapter 2, Getting Started with MotionPanel.

Installing MotionPanel

For complete installation instructions, see the *PowerStation Model P1 User Guide*, included on the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD.

Configuring and Downloading Applications

Although the Interact runtime screens in MotionPanel are pre-configured, program flow operations and data input functions are application-specific. You will need to configure them using MachineShop for MotionPanel on a development PC, save your settings in PTM, and then download them to the MotionPanel CF card.

For information about how to develop Interact applications and download them, see the *MachineShop Getting Started Guide*, included on the MachineShop for Motion-Panel Installation CD.

Getting Started with MotionPanel

MotionPanel can communicate with any Compumotor 6K controller via Ethernet or serial connection. The system is factory-configured to communicate via Ethernet. But whether you use Ethernet or serial communications, you can connect MotionPanel with one or more 6K controllers and have your network ready to run in just a few steps.

This chapter lists the Compumotor controllers that MotionPanel supports. It then explains how to connect MotionPanel and a 6K controller and configure your network for Ethernet or serial communication.

Note For information about MotionPanel's specifications, see the *PowerStation Model P1 User Guide*, included on the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD.

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Controller Compatibility

MotionPanel is factory-configured to communicate with any Compumotor 6K controller via Ethernet or serial connection. The Compumotor 6K series includes the following:

- 6K2
- 6K4
- 6K6
- 6K8

MotionPanel also can communicate with any of the following Compumotor devices by serial connection only. You may need to modify some panels when using serial connections.

- Zeta 610N
- Apexd 615N
- OEM 6200
- OEM 6250
- GV6K (future development)
- GT6K (future development)

Setting up a 6K **Network**

You can enable your MotionPanel to communicate with a Compumotor 6K controller via Ethernet or serial connection. This section explains how to create both types of connections.

Important You may want to connect the MotionPanel to a 6K controller and test the network connection before installing the MotionPanel in its permanent location. For information about how to install Motion-Panel, see the PowerStation Model P1 User Guide, included on the MachineShop for Motion-Panel Installation CD.

Setting up Ethernet Communication

To set up Ethernet communication between MotionPanel and a 6K controller, you will connect the MotionPanel and the controller by crossover cable (shipped with Motion-Panel) and then enable the controller's Ethernet port.

To connect the MotionPanel and a 6K controller via **Ethernet, complete the following steps:**

1. Connect one end of your Ethernet cable to the MotionPanel, as shown in Figure 2-1.



Figure 2-1: Connecting an Ethernet Cable to Motion-Panel

2. Connect the other end of the cable to the controller, as shown in Figure 2-2.



Figure 2-2: Connecting an Ethernet Cable to the Controller

3. Connect power (24 VDC) to the MotionPanel and the controller, as shown in Figure 2-3.





Figure 2-3: Connecting Power to MotionPanel and the Controller

Compumotor 6K controllers are factory-configured to communicate through their serial ports. To get them to communicate with MotionPanel via Ethernet, you must enable the controller's Ethernet port. To do this, you must have the following software installed:

- Compumotor 6K controller operating system v. 5.1.3 or higher (in the controller)
- Motion Planner v. 2.70 or higher (in your development PC)

Note Motion Planner is shipped with Compumotor 6K controllers.

To enable the Ethernet port on a 6K controller, complete the following steps:

- 1. Using a serial cable, connect your development PC to the COM2 port on the 6K controller.
- 2. Start the development PC.
- 3. Launch Motion Planner on the development PC.

Note For information on how to use Motion Planner, see the *6K series Command Reference*.

The Default Communications Settings dialog box will appear.




Figure 2-4: Selecting the 6K Controller

4. On the **Product** tab, select the 6K controller that you will use, as shown in Figure 2-4.

Note The default port setting for the development PC is **COM1**. If you wish, you can confirm this by selecting the **Port** tab.

5. Click **OK** to save your default communication settings.

The Motion Planner window will appear.

6. In the Motion Planner window, select the **Terminal1** tab.

The Terminal 1 emulator screen will appear, as shown in Figure 2-5.

If you are connecting MotionPanel to just one controller, complete step 7, and then go to step 10. If you are connecting MotionPanel to more than one controller, go to step 8 now.




Figure 2-6: NTFEN1 Commands

7. Type the following commands in the Terminal1 screen, as shown in Figure 2-6. Press **Enter** after each command.

```
NTFEN1
NTADDR 192,168,10,30
NTMASK 255,255,255,0
```

8. Type **TNT** in the Terminal1 screen, as shown in Figure 2-7, and then press **Enter**.

The following information will appear on the screen.

```
ECHO1

> TNT

*6K ETHERNET STATUS

*Ethernet enabled: NTFEN1

*6K IP address: 192 168 10.30

*6K Network Mask: 255.255.255.0

*6K Ethernet address: 0-144-85-0-3-242 (decimal)

- 9. Below this information, type **NTFEN2**.
- 10. At the bottom of the Terminal1 screen, type **Reset**, and then press **Enter**.

11. Turn on the MotionPanel, as shown in Figure 2-8.




Figure 2-9: MotionPanel Main Menu

The MotionPanel Main Menu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-9.

You can now run the MotionPanel Interact application.

Ethernet settings in MotionPanel

Ethernet settings in MotionPanel are factory-configured. You can verify them in the MachineShop Shell.

To verify MotionPanel's Ethernet settings, complete the following steps:

- 1. Connect a keyboard to the MotionPanel.
- 2. From the Shell Main Menu, select Settings.

The Settings submenu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-10.

3. On the Settings submenu, select TCP/IP.

The TCP/IP Setup menu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-11.

4. On the TCP/IP Setup menu, select **NET SETUP**.

The TCP/IP Network Setup menu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-12.

5. On the Network Setup menu, select **NET 1**.

The NET 1 submenu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-13.

6. Select the button for each of the settings listed in the left column below, and verify that the settings match those shown in the right column.

Note You must select the **IFACE TYPE** setting first in order to activate the other setup buttons.

IFACE TYPE : NE2000

IP ADDRESS : 192.168.10.29
IP MASK : 255.255.255.0

PORT ADDRESS : 280
IRQ : 10
DOWNLOAD ONLY : OFF

After you have entered each setting, select **NET 1** to return to the NET 1 submenu, and select another button to verify a setting.

Important You can change MotionPanel's Ethernet settings, but be very careful when doing so. A typo or punctuation error will set the wrong parameter.

7. When you have finished verifying Ethernet settings, select **Back** to return to the TCP/IP Setup Menu and **Back** again to return to the Shell Main Menu.

Cable diagrams




Figure 2-14: Ethernet Cable Diagrams

If you must construct an Ethernet cable for your 6K network, refer to the diagrams in Figure 2-14.

Setting up Serial Communication

To set up serial communication between MotionPanel and a 6K controller, you must complete the following steps:

- Connect MotionPanel and the controller by serial cable
- Configure MotionPanel to use one of its serial ports to communicate with the controller
- Configure the controller to use one of its serial ports to communicate with MotionPanel
- Configure the CMOT driver for serial communication

Connecting MotionPanel and a 6K controller

To connect MotionPanel and a 6K controller via serial cable, complete the following steps:

1. Connect power (24 VDC) to the MotionPanel and the controller, as shown in Figure 2-15.





Figure 2-15: Connecting Power to MotionPanel and the Controller

- 2. Connect one end of your serial cable to the COM1 port on the MotionPanel.
- 3. Connect the other end of the serial cable to the COM1 port on the controller.

MotionPanel is factory-configured to communicate with a 6K controller via Ethernet. To use a serial connection between these devices, you must configure the Motion-Panel to communicate through one of its serial ports.

Configuring MotionPanel to use a serial port

To configure MotionPanel to use a serial port, complete the following steps:

- 1. Connect a keyboard to the MotionPanel.
- 2. From the Shell Main Menu, select **Settings**.

The Settings submenu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-16 on page 23.

3. On the Settings submenu, select **TCP/IP**.

The TCP/IP Setup menu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-17.

4. On the TCP/IP Setup menu, select **NET SETUP**.

The TCP/IP Network Setup menu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-18 on page 24.

5. On the Network Setup menu, select **NET 2**.




Figure 2-19: NET 2 Submenu

The NET 2 submenu will appear, as shown in Figure 2-19.

6. Select the button for each of the settings listed in the left column below, and enter the settings listed in the right column.

Note You must enter the **IFACE TYPE** setting first in order to activate the other setup buttons.

IFACE TYPE : Serial
IP ADDRESS : 10.0.0.2
IP MASK : 255.255.255.0

PORT ADDRESS : 3F8
IRQ : 4
DOWNLOAD ONLY : ON

After you have entered each setting, select **NET 2** to return to the NET 2 submenu, and select another button to enter a new setting.

- 7. When you have finished entering the network settings, select **Back** to return to the TCP/IP Setup Menu and **Back** again to return to the Shell Main Menu.
- 8. You can now run the MotionPanel Interact application.

Note For further information about MachineShop Shell settings, see the *MachineShop Shell Runtime Guide*.

Compumotor 6K controllers are factory-configured to communicate via serial communication. If you have previously configured your 6K controller for Ethernet communication, you will have to re-configure it to use one of its serial ports.

To configure the 6K controller to use a serial port, complete the following steps:

- 1. Using a serial cable, connect your development PC to the COM2 port on the 6K controller.
- 2. Start the development PC.
- 3. Launch Motion Planner on the development PC.

Note For information on how to use Motion Planner, see the Compumotor 6K series Command Reference

The Default Communications Settings dialog box will appear.




Figure 2-20: Selecting the 6K Controller

4. On the **Product** tab, select the 6K controller that you will use, as shown in Figure 2-20 on page 26.

Note The default port setting for the development PC is **COM1**. If you wish, you can confirm this by selecting the **Port** tab.

5. Click **OK** to save your default communication settings.

The Motion Planner window will appear.

6. In the Motion Planner window, select the **Terminal1** tab.

The Terminal1 emulator screen will appear, as shown in Figure 2-21.




Figure 2-22: NTFEN0 Commands

7. Type the following commands in the Terminal1 screen, as shown in Figure 2-22 on page 27. Press **Enter** after each command.

Configuring the CMOT driver for serial communication

To configure the CMOT driver for serial communication, complete the following steps:

1. On your development PC, launch MachineShop for MotionPanel from the shortcut on your Windows desktop.

The MachineShop Welcome screen will appear.

2. Select **Open an Existing MachineShop Project**, as shown in Figure 2-23.

3. Select the MotionPanel Interact application: **MOTPANEL**.

4. Select the Interact icon in the middle of the Machine-Shop toolbar, as shown in Figure 2-24.

Interact will open the MotionPanel application, and the Application browser will appear, as shown in Figure 2-25.

5. Select the Compumotor 6K/6000 Driver (CMOT), as shown in Figure 2-25.




Figure 2-26: CMOT Driver Ethernet Connection

The CMOT driver dialog box will appear, as shown in Figure 2-26. Note that the **Ethernet** connection is selected on the Connection tab.




Figure 2-27: CMOT Driver Serial Connection

6. On the Connection tab, select the Serial connection, as shown in Figure 2-27 on page 29.

Click **OK** to accept your new setting, and Exit Interact.

You can now run the MotionPanel application.




Figure 2-28: Serial Cable Diagrams

MachineShop for MotionPanel

The MotionPanel workstation comes with a copy of MachineShop for MotionPanel software, distributed on the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD (KA-83233). When installed on a development PC, MachineShop for MotionPanel will allow you to customize the Interact application that is factory-installed on MotionPanel's Compact Flash (CF) card. This chapter identifies the components of MachineShop for MotionPanel and explains how you can use the FlashBack utility to restore MotionPanel's operating software to a CF card.

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Introducing **MachineShop** for MotionPanel

You can customize your Interact application screens using a specially designed version of CTC's MachineShop HMI software called MachineShop for MotionPanel.

Important Although the Interact runtime screens on Motion-Panel's CF card are pre-configured, program flow operations and data input functions are application-specific. You will need to configure them using MachineShop for MotionPanel on a development PC, save your settings in Interact PTM, and then download the settings to the CF card. For information about how to develop Interact applications and download them, see the MachineShop Getting Started Guide, included on the Machine-Shop for MotionPanel Installation CD.

MachineShop for MotionPanel includes the Interact Application Manager (APM) and Panel Tool Kit Module (PTM), and the Compumotor 6K/6000 (CMOT) Device Driver.

Installing MachineShop for **MotionPanel**

MachineShop for MotionPanel is distributed on the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD (KA-83233), which includes all of the software and documentation you will need to use MotionPanel.

To install MachineShop for MotionPanel, complete the following steps:

1. Insert the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD into the CD-ROM drive of your development PC.

If automatic installation is enabled on your system, installation will begin, and the Setup Welcome dialog box will appear. Go to step 4.

If automatic installation is disabled, complete steps 2-

2. On the Windows taskbar, click **Start**, and then click Run.

The Run dialog box will appear.

3. In the Run dialog box, next to the word "Open," type **D:\Setup.EXE**, and click **OK**. (If necessary, substitute your CD-ROM drive letter for **D**.)

The Setup Welcome dialog box will appear.

4. Select Next.

The Select Operation dialog box will appear.




Figure 3-1: MachineShop Select Operation

5. Select the **MachineShop for MotionPanel** button, and follow the installation wizard to install the program.

Important When asked, be sure to select a **Typical** installation.

A Typical installation will install the following items:

- MachineShop Setup program
- MachineShop Toolbar

Documentation includes online help for Machine-Shop and Interact; the Interact Online Tutorial; and PDF files for the *MotionPanel User Guide*, *Power-Station Model P1 User Guide*, *MachineShop Getting Started Guide*, and the *MachineShop Runtime Guide*. Adobe Acrobat Reader, installed with MachineShop for MotionPanel, enables you to read these files.

Note The starred () networking components will be installed if they are not already on your computer. You may be asked to configure these components as they are installed. Configuration instructions are in the *MachineShop Installation Booklet*, shipped with the MachineShop for MotionPanel CD

Setup also will automatically add the Compumotor Motion Planner suite component to the MachineShop toolbar if you install Motion Planner on your development PC before running the setup program. Motion Planner will appear as a tab on the toolbar.

Using the FlashBack Utility

MotionPanel uses a Compact Flash card as its startup drive. This card contains the MS-DOS 6.22 operating system, the MachineShop Shell, and all of MotionPanel's pre-configured application screens. If any of these files is deleted or becomes corrupted, and you wish to replace it, or if you want to create a new, bootable CF card, you can do so easily by using the FlashBack utility. FlashBack restores all of MotionPanel's operating software to a CF card in one, simple operation. To do this, you will open FlashBack from the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD (KA-83233) and use the instructions in the FlashBack online help to reformat the CF card.

To reformat a CF card for MotionPanel, complete the following steps:

1. Insert the MachineShop for MotionPanel Installation CD into the CD-ROM drive of your development PC.

If automatic installation is enabled on your system, installation will begin, and the Setup Welcome dialog box will appear. Go to step 4.

If automatic installation is disabled, complete steps 2-3.

2. On the Windows taskbar, click **Start**, and then click **Run**

The Run dialog box will appear.

3. In the Run dialog box, next to the word "Open," type **D:\Setup.EXE**, and click **OK**. (If necessary, substitute your CD-ROM drive letter for **D**.)

The Setup Welcome dialog box will appear.

4. Select Next.

The Select Operation dialog box will appear, as shown in Figure 3-1 on page 33.

5. Select the **Run Flashback Utility** button.




Figure 3-2: FlashBack Utility Dialog Box

The FlashBack Utility dialog box will appear as shown in Figure 3-2.

6. Click the **Help** button to find complete, online instructions for operating the FlashBack utility.

Note If you wish, you can copy **FlashUtil.exe** to a directory of your choosing on your hard drive and run the utility from there.

MotionPanel Screens

MotionPanel is a runtime system. The MachineShop Shell and a complete Interact application, created with Interact's Panel Toolkit Module (PTM), are factory-installed on a Compact Flash (CF) card shipped with all MotionPanel workstations. The application consists of over 45 Interact runtime screens. During runtime, you can control and monitor system parameters by navigating through these screens.

This chapter describes the MotionPanel screens and their functions.

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Screen Topology

Table 4-1, below and on page 39, illustrates the overall structure of the Interact runtime screens in MotionPanel. Subsequent sections describe the individual screens and their functions.

Screen **Descriptions**

This section provides brief descriptions of each of the Interact runtime screens used by MotionPanel. The Compumotor 6K/6000 (CMOT) Device Driver commands supported by each screen appear in parentheses after each description. For detailed definitions of these commands, see the Compumotor 6K Series Command Reference.

Important Most of the pre-configured screens in Motion-Panel are designed for system monitoring and troubleshooting during runtime. However, program flow operations and data input functions are application-specific. You will have to configure them using MachineShop for Motion-Panel on a development PC, save your settings in Interact PTM, and then download the settings to the MotionPanel CF card. For information about how to develop Interact applications and download them, see the MachineShop Getting Started Guide, included on the MachineShop for Motion-Panel Installation CD.

Main Menu




Figure 4-1: MotionPanel Main Menu

The MotionPanel Main Menu is shown in Figure 4-1. From it, you have access to each of the six categories of screens in MotionPanel.

Setup/Control — These screens enable you to set up or download programs and conduct terminal operations.

- **Task Information** These screens display important task and error information
- **Axis Information** These screens provide current information about motion parameters.
- **I/O Information** These screens provide current expansion I/O information.
- **Diagnostics** These screens provide diagnostic information about 6K controller operations.
- Load Panel If you select this button, a list of all of MotionPanel's preconfigured screens will appear. Select any screen that you want to display.

An **Online/Offline** notation in the upper left portion of the Main Menu shows whether Ethernet is online or offline.

Navigation Buttons

At the bottom of most other MotionPanel screens, you will find four buttons that will help you navigate through the screens. These buttons are shown in Figure 4-2.

- **Back** Brings up the previous screen in the category (see *Screen Topology* on page 38).
- Main Returns you to the MotionPanel Main Menu.
- **Help** Brings up a detailed explanation of the current screen.
- **Forward** Brings up the next screen in the category (see *Screen Topology* on page 38).

In the last screen of each category, the **Forward** button is replaced by a button that will return you to the first screen in the category. That button is shown in Figure 4-3.

To move to another category of screens, select **Main.** You will return to the Main Menu.

Setup/Control

These screens enable you to set up or download programs and conduct terminal operations. They also provide information about communication between Interact and the CMOT driver and enable you to enable or disable drives.

Driveen

This screen allows you to enable or disable each drive. It also reports the status (type) of the drive: **Stepper** or **Servo** (+/-10V). (DRIVE)

Homlimstat

This screen provides Home limit status information. It also allows you to test Home by selecting a negative or a positive Home. (TAS 5, 15, 16)

This screen provides jogging capabilities for Axes 1 through 4.




Figure 4-6: Jogax1

This screen provides jogging capabilities for Axes 5 through 8.




Figure 4-7: Jogax2

Program

This screen enables you to download programs (*.prg) from MotionPanel. Also available on this screen are options to reset the 6K controller and kill any program before downloading.

You can pause (or continue) each task shown in this screen by selecting the appropriate button. The Supervisory Task button enables you to pause or continue all tasks at once.

Comstatus

This screen shows the status of communication between Interact and the CMOT driver: **Online** or **Offline**. It also displays error information concerning communication between Interact and the driver.

This screen displays the most important system status information. (TSS bits 1, 3, 8, 30)




Figure 4-12: Systat

This screen displays the most important program status bits. (TSS bits 12, 13, 14, and 15)




Figure 4-13: Pgrstate

This screen provides formatted error status information related to multi-tasking. (TER bits 6, 7, 8, 16)




Figure 4-14: Tasker




Figure 4-16: Motpar




Figure 4-17: Motpar2

This screen displays the motion axis status bits for each axis. (TAS 1, 2, 3, 4)




Figure 4-18: Motaxis

This screen provides the servo-related status bits for each axis. (TAS 23, 24, 25)




Figure 4-19: Servost

This screen groups the controller mode status bits for each axis. (TAS 6, 7, 8, 9)




Figure 4-20: Cotrlmod

This screen functionally groups the most important following parameters for each axis. (TPMAS, TVMAS)




Figure 4-21: Advmot

This screen also groups important following parameters. (TPSLV, TNMCY)




Figure 4-22: Advmot2




Figure 4-23: Follsta

This screen enables you to monitor advanced following status information for each axis. (TFS 9, 10, 13, 24)




Figure 4-24: Advfolst

This screen provides the current status of Home limit, the positive end of travel limit, and the negative end of travel limit for each axis. (TLIM)




Figure 4-25: Onbdlim

This screen provides the current status of onboard outputs. There are four outputs for 6K2 and 6K4 controllers, and eight outputs for 6K6 controllers.




Figure 4-26: Onbdout

Brickmenu

This screen summarizes information about the I/O bricks connected to the controller. Up to eight bricks can be connected to each 6K controller. Four expansion configurations (sims) can be included in each brick: analog input, analog output, discrete input, and discrete output. Select any of the eight buttons in this screen to generate an I/O Status screen for that brick (see *Brick I/O Status*, below).




Figure 4-29: Brick I/O Status




Figure 4-32: Entry

This screen displays the drive status of each axis. (TAS 13, 14, 15, and TASX .5)




Figure 4-33: Drvstat
